With the announcement of in-person classes for fall, we would like to provide some additional information so you can make informed choices as you choose your classes for fall.

- The online listing of classes for fall was made before the announcement of how fall classes would be conducted. There may be some changes in the format (online versus inperson) before classes open up for registration.
- All classes, whether online or in-person, will be taught with the presumption that students will be in Provo. The timing of classes, exams, homeworks and other due dates will be done under the assumption that students are in Provo. High-risk students (https://www.byu.edu/coronavirus/high-risk-individuals) should only enroll in online courses and should inform the instructor about their circumstances at the beginning of the semester.
- Given the presumption that students will be in Provo, professors of online courses may request students to visit during office hours or attend special sessions on campus. Professors would like to get to know students even under the current unusual circumstances. Such in-person visits will facilitate the contact and connections that a university education ought to provide.
